## What to See & Do: Fish Market

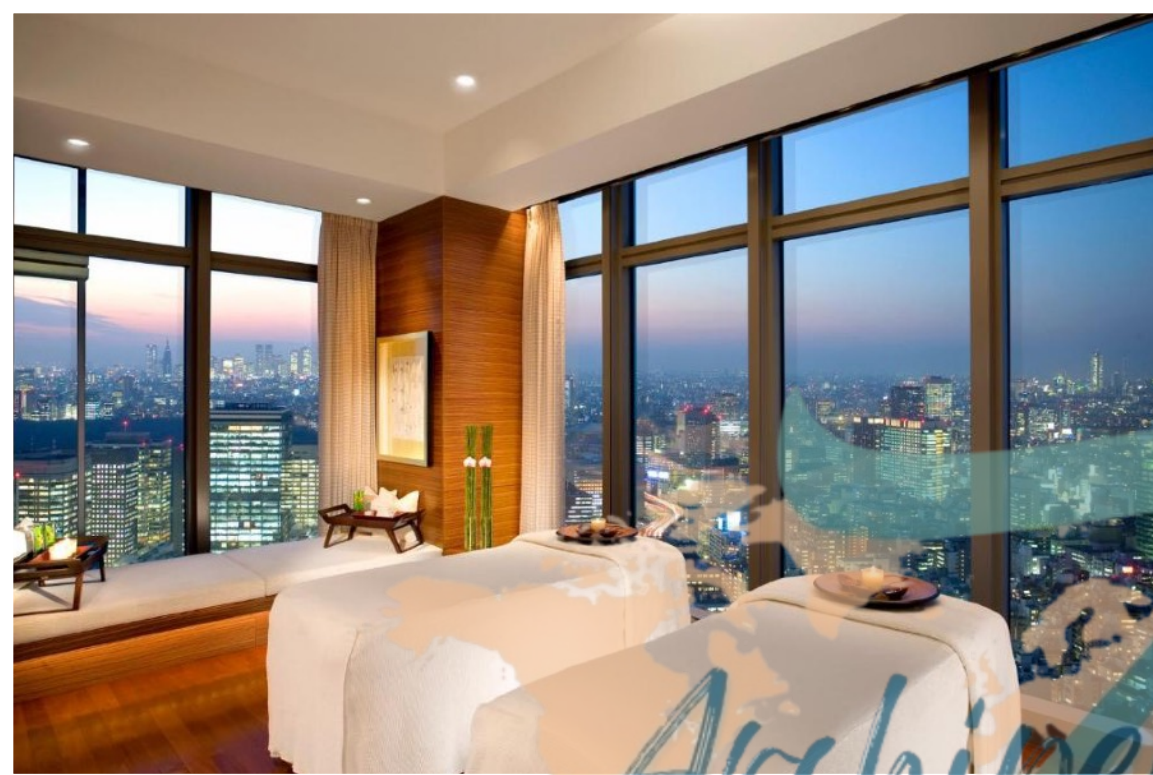
